

Student enrolments on Higher Education courses: Northern Ireland 2004/05

10 February 2006

This statistical bulletin has been produced by the Department for Employment and Learning Northern Ireland (NI), using data collected by the Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA), the Department for Employment and Learning and various education departments in Great Britain (GB) and the Republic of Ireland (RoI). It provides details of NI domiciled students on higher education (HE) courses in the United Kingdom (UK) and RoI, and details of all students on HE courses in NI institutions for the academic year 2004/05. It also provides a time series of enrolments covering the period 2000/01 to 2004/05.

Key Points

NI domiciled students enrolled on higher education courses in the UK and Republic of Ireland

Total enrolment trends	The total number of Northern Ireland (NI) domiciled students enrolled on higher education (HE) courses in the UK and Republic of Ireland (RoI) has increased by 9% between 2000/01 and 2004/05, rising from 74,050 to 80,625 enrolments.
Enrolments by mode and level of study	Of the 80,625 NI domiciled students enrolled on HE courses in the UK and RoI in 2004/05, 49,295 were enrolled on a full-time basis and 31,330 on a part-time basis. Undergraduate enrolments stood at 69,225, whilst there were 11,400 postgraduate enrolments.
Enrolments by country of institution, mode and level of study	In 2004/05, 74% of NI domiciled students studied at NI institutions, 24% at GB institutions (including 5% at the Open University) and 1% at RoI institutions. Among full-time students, some 28% of undergraduates and 33% of postgraduates studied outside NI.
Full-time enrolment trends by level of study and country of institution	The number of NI domiciled full-time undergraduate students at NI institutions has increased by 19% between 2000/01 and 2004/05 while at GB institutions they decreased by less than 1%. Over the same period NI domiciled full-time postgraduate students at NI institutions decreased by 3% while at GB institutions they increased by 9%.
Enrolments by level of study and age	In 2004/05, 54% of NI domiciled students (of known age) who enrolled on first degree courses in the UK and RoI were aged under 21 compared to 21% of other undergraduate students.
Enrolments by gender and level of study	In 2004/05, females accounted for 60% of NI domiciled students studying HE in the UK and RoI: 60% of undergraduate students and 58% of postgraduate students.
First year full- time undergraduate enrolment trends by country of institution	The number of NI domiciled full-time undergraduate first year students at NI institutions has increased by 10% between 2000/01 and 2004/05 and at GB institutions they also increased by 10%.
Enrolments by mode and subject of study	In 2004/05, the most popular subject areas of NI domiciled students studying in the UK ¹ were business and administrative studies with 6,650 (14%) full-time enrolments and 6,885 (22%) part-time enrolments, and subjects allied to medicine with 6,415 (13%) full-time enrolments and 4,735 (15%) part-time enrolments.

Enrolments by gender and subject of study In 2004/05, of those NI domiciled students on HE courses in the UK², females accounted for 85% of students studying subjects allied to medicine, 73% of those studying education and 70% of those studying social studies. Males accounted for 85% of students studying engineering & technology, 77% of those studying architecture, building & planning and 74% of those studying computer science.

Enrolments on higher education courses at Northern Ireland institutions

Total enrolment trends	Total enrolments on HE courses at NI institutions have increased by 11% over the period 2000/01 to 2004/05, growing from 61,125 to 67,770.
Enrolments by mode and level of study	Of the 67,770 students enrolled on HE courses at NI institutions in 2004/05, 39,435 were enrolled on a full-time basis and 28,335 on a part-time basis. Undergraduate enrolments stood at 56,040, while there were 11,730 postgraduate enrolments.
Enrolments by domicile of student and level of study	In 2004/05, 88% of students enrolled on HE courses at NI institutions were from NI, 2% from GB, 7% from RoI and 3% from elsewhere. NI domiciled students accounted for 92% of undergraduate students and 70% of postgraduate students at NI institutions.
Enrolment trends by mode, level of study and domicile of student	Between 2000/01 and 2004/05 full-time undergraduate enrolments at NI institutions increased by 17% while part-time undergraduate enrolments increased by 4%. Full-time postgraduate enrolments showed no change while part-time increased by 11% during this period. Over the same period, students from NI enrolled on HE courses at NI institutions have increased by 10%, students from GB by 40%, students from Rol by 14% and students from elsewhere by 25%.
Enrolments by level of study and age	In 2004/05, 54% of students (of known age) on first degree courses at NI institutions were aged under 21 compared to 22% of other undergraduate students.
Enrolments by mode of study and subject of study	The most popular subject areas among full-time students at NI institutions in 2004/05 were subjects allied to medicine with 5,745 enrolments (15%) followed by business & administrative studies with 5,685 enrolments (14%). The same subject areas were the most popular for part-time students, with 6,930 (24%) studying business and administrative studies and 5,395 (19%) studying subjects allied to medicine.

Enrolments by gender and level of study	In 2004/05, females accounted for 61% of students on HE courses at NI institutions: 62% of undergraduates and 58% of postgraduates.
Enrolments by gender and subject of study	In 2004/05, of those students enrolled on HE courses at NI institutions, females accounted for 85% of students studying subjects allied to medicine, 73% of those studying education and 72% of those studying social studies. Males accounted for 85% of students studying engineering & technology, 77% of those studying architecture, building & planning and 72% of those studying computer science.
First year enrolment trends by mode, level of study and domicile of student	Between 2000/01 and 2004/05 full-time undergraduate first year enrolments at NI institutions increased by 11%. Over the same period, total first year students from NI enrolled on HE courses at NI institutions have increased by 7%, students from GB by 53%, students from RoI by 17% and students from elsewhere increased by 7%.
Enrolments trends by institution, level and mode of study	At Queen's University Belfast there was an increase of 15% in total enrolments in the period 2000/01 to 2004/05, with undergraduate and postgraduate enrolments increasing 14% and 18% respectively. Over the same period full-time and part-time enrolments increased by 14% and 16% respectively.
	At St. Mary's University College there was an increase of 17% in enrolments in the period 2000/01 to 2004/05, with undergraduate enrolments increasing by 25% and postgraduate enrolments decreasing by 22%. Over the same period full-time enrolments increased by 34% whilst part-time enrolments fell by 40%.
	At Stranmillis University College enrolments have increased by 20% between 2000/01 and 2004/05, with undergraduate enrolments increasing by 21% and postgraduate enrolments by 12%. Over this period full-time enrolments increased by 29%, with part-time enrolments showing no change.
	At the University of Ulster enrolments have increased by 15% between 2000/01 and 2004/05, with undergraduate and postgraduate enrolments increasing by 20% and 1% respectively. Over this period full-time enrolments increased by 18% and part-time enrolments by 10%.

Notes to Readers

General

- The Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA) is the official agency for the collection of information on publicly funded Higher Education (HE) institutions in the UK. It was set up in 1993 following the White Paper 'Higher Education: a new framework', which called for more coherence in HE statistics. HE institutions include all publicly-funded universities. HESA data relate to students in HE institutions in the UK but do not include students on HE courses at Further Education (FE) colleges in Northern Ireland (NI) or Great Britain (GB) nor at institutions in the Republic of Ireland (Rol).
- 2. Information on HE courses at FE colleges in NI is obtained from the Further Education Statistical Record (FESR), which is a statistical return collected by the Department for Employment and Learning. As FESR information for the 2004/05 student year was not available at the time of going to press, student numbers have been held at 2003/04 levels. FESR information is based on full year data. However, in both 2001/02 and 2002/03 one college's information was based on a snapshot of enrolments at 1st November of the relevant year due to technical difficulties obtaining full-year data.
- 3. Information on HE courses at FE colleges in GB and at institutions in the Rol has been obtained from the various education departments responsible for collecting this information. Where these data have been used, they have been held at 2003/04 levels, as 2004/05 figures were not available at the time of going to press. Data on Rol enrolments is not available by level of study and figures in the enclosed tables have been apportioned to levels using the latest available breakdown.
- 4. The academic year runs from 1st August to 31st July.
- 5. HESA information relates to individual enrolments. As a student can be enrolled on more than one programme of study, the number of enrolments may exceed the number of students.
- 6. Students referred to as NI domiciled are those whose permanent place of residence was in NI prior to enrolment on an HE course.

Statistical

Definition of Higher education

7. HE is defined as a course leading to a qualification above that of level 3 of the National Qualifications Framework, i.e. above A-level standard. This includes first degree and postgraduate study, higher national diploma and certificate courses and a number of professional qualifications.

Count of students

- 8. There have been recent changes in HE provision, in particular the increasing trend towards non-traditional academic year patterns (traditional academic year patterns being those in which the student commences each year of their course in September/October and completes the year in May/June). As a consequence of this, HESA/FESR data are now a count of enrolments across the entire academic year as opposed to a snapshot of enrolments on the 1st December/1st November (which was the basis of the student count in HE statistical publications published by the Department prior to 2002/03). From 2002/03 this statistical bulletin has included a time series of enrolment data starting 2000/01 which is based on enrolments across the entire academic year.
- 9. Student enrolments recorded with domicile UK region unknown and Channel Islands and Isle of Man are included in the GB category for the purposes of this bulletin.

First year students

10. First year students are based on the HESA standard registration population who commenced their programme of study in the reporting period relevant to the data collection year.

Level of courses

- 11. Level of course is defined by qualification aim;
 - (i) *Postgraduate courses* are those leading to higher degrees, diplomas and certificates (including postgraduate certificate of education (PGCE) and professional qualifications) which usually require a first degree as an entry qualification.
 - (ii) First degree courses include first degrees with or without eligibility to register to practise with a health or social care or veterinary statutory regulatory body, first degrees with qualified teacher status, enhanced first degrees, first degrees obtained concurrently with a diploma and intercalated first degrees.
 - (iii) Other undergraduate courses includes all HE courses not included in (ii) above, for example undergraduate diplomas and certificates, HNDs, HNCs and foundation degrees.

Mode of attendance

- 12. Mode of attendance distinguishes students studying full-time or part-time:
 - (i) Full-time students include all students studying full-time (for at least 24 weeks in the academic year), students on thick or thin sandwich courses, and those on a study-related year out of their institution.

- (ii) Part-time students include those studying part-time, full-time for less than 24 weeks, during evenings only, or on block release. Part-time also includes students writing up theses or on sabbatical.
- (iii) Students who are categorised as dormant are not included in the tables.

Students writing up theses or on sabbatical are included with the part-time mode of attendance.

Age

13. Age is as at 31st August within the relevant academic year.

Open University

- 14. In the tables the Open University is treated as an English institution as it's administrative centre is located in England. This follows the standard UK statistical convention. However, most NI domiciled students enrolled at the Open University study in NI. The number of NI domiciled students studying with the Open University is presented in Table 6.
- 15. Prior to the 2003/04 academic year, all Open University students were recorded as enrolled on other undergraduate courses. In 2003/04 the Open University changed its reporting practice so that students were recorded according to their declared award intention and broad subject of study. However, as not all students declare this information, a number are still reported as studying for institutional credit, which is categorized as other undergraduate, within the "combined" subject of study. The impact of this change has resulted in an increase in the number of students undertaking first degree courses, a decrease in the number undertaking other undergraduate courses and more detailed information on the subjects being studied by students.

Changes to subject areas from 2002/03

- 16. Subject area groupings have changed from those used in 2001/02 and before. HESA and the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service (UCAS) developed a common subject coding system (JACS), which was introduced from the 2002/03 academic year, in which enrolments are aggregated to 19 broad subject areas, although the new subject areas look similar and are closely related to the previous subject areas, the new system is not by any means identical, as the subjects within each group may have changed.
- 17. In addition to the move to the JACS coding system, a new procedure for apportioning students to subject areas was introduced by HESA in 2002/03. Under the previous coding system, students were allocated to a subject area which reflected the majority of their course. Where this was not possible students were allocated to a "combined" subject area. Under the new procedure, where a student's course covers more than one subject area, the headcount is divided in a way that reflects the pattern of the split programme. Depending on their academic content, enrolments have been assigned to the 19 subject areas according to the following rules:

- (i) a programme in a single subject is allocated to its area.
- (ii) if a combination of two subjects lies within one area, the programme is allocated to that area.
- (iii) if a combination of subjects lies within more than one area, the programme is allocated to subject areas according to the following apportionment:
 - 50%:50% for a balanced two-way split;
 - 67%:33% for a major/minor two-way split;
 - 33%:33%:33% for a balanced three-way split.
- (iv) all subject combinations containing initial teacher training (ITT) at undergraduate level which also have a subject recorded are apportioned 50% to 'Education' and the remaining 50% is further apportioned as shown in (iii) above. Where no subject other than education is recorded or where the student is on a PGCE course, apportionment is 100% to 'Education'.
- 18. Any comparison between the JACS subject areas (2002/03 onwards) and the previous HESA subjects areas (2001/02 and earlier) should be viewed in the context of these changes.
