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

Figure 2 - Population per 100 ha of Utilised Agricultural Area (UAA), 2011





Figure 4 - Proportion of gross turnover by subsector, NI (Provisional 2011)




Figure 5 - Proportion of employee jobs by Industry section, December 2012



Figure 6 - Trend in dairy and beef cow numbers, NI, 1997 - 2012



Figure 7 - Average size of selected livestock enterprises, NI, 1997 - 2012



Figure 8 - Full - time labour on NI farms, 1992, 2002 and 2010 - 2012



Figure 9 - Estimated value of recorded landings of fish into NI, 2003 - 2012


