







Figure 3 - Gross turnover and full time equivalent (FTE) workforce by food processing subsector, NI (Provisional 2013)






Figure 5 - Proportion of employee jobs by Industry section, December 2014








Figure 7 - Average size of selected livestock enterprises, NI, 1999 - 2014

Figure 8 - Full - time labour on NI farms, 1994, 2004 and 2012 - 2014





