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Statistics from the Northern Ireland Needle and Syringe Exchange Scheme: 1 April 2008 – 31 March 2009

This bulletin summarises information on people visiting the Needle and Syringe Exchange Scheme and relates to the twelve-month period ending 31 March 2009. It is the eighth bulletin reporting on information collected on the operation of the Northern Ireland Needle and Syringe Exchange Scheme (NSES), which began operation in April 2001.

Summary

In Northern Ireland during 2008/09:

- There were 13,389 visits to participating pharmacies by users of the scheme. This is an increase of 18% (2,002 visits) on the 2007/08 figure (11,387 visits).
- A cin bin is a sealed container which is used to safely dispose of used needles and syringes: 53% of cin bins issued to users of the scheme were returned in 2008/09 compared to 54% returned the previous year.
- 135,700 syringes were issued in 2008/09. This is a 16% increase from 2007/08 (116,935 syringes).
- Over four fifths of visits (86%) were made by male clients.
- Over half (55%) of all visits were made by individuals aged 31 years and over, just over a quarter (26%) by 26-30 year olds and a fifth (20%) by individuals aged 25 years and under.
- 108 visits were made by an outreach worker on behalf of a client; this is an increase of 32% (26 visits) on the 2007/08 figure (82 visits). In total 2,070 syringes were issued by outreach workers in 2008/09 compared to 1,330 in 2007/08.

1. Background

- 1.1 Needle Exchange Schemes are a service for injecting drug users, targeted as a harm reduction measure to help limit the spread of blood borne viruses such as HIV and Hepatitis B and C.
- 1.2 In 2000 funding was made available to develop a free needle and syringe exchange scheme in community pharmacies in Northern Ireland. With input from community pharmacists and other expert advisors, and taking account of models of best practice developed elsewhere, the Northern Ireland Needle and Syringe Exchange Scheme (NSES) was introduced in April 2001.
- 1.3 Initially five pharmacies were involved in the scheme; by the end of 2008/09 there were ten pharmacies offering needle and syringe exchange. Pharmacies were chosen based on their willingness to participate, their location, and the assessed need for needle exchange in the locality.

2. Data Collection

- 2.1 Information on syringe transactions is collected from participating only Administrative input from pharmacies. pharmacy staff is kept to a minimum and statistics are collected at the end of each month. The information is collated within the Department of Health, Social Services, and Public Safety by the Public Health Information and Research Branch (PHIRB).
- **2.2** At the start of 2008/09 the NSES Daily Log was revised. Information is now collected on the number and size of packs issued at each exchange. Packs contain either 5 (half pack) or 10 (full pack) syringes, and syringe sizes include 1ml, 2ml or 5ml. The syringes in the 1ml packs have needles attached. Pharmacies

also issue needles to accompany the 2ml and 5ml packs but the number of needles issued is not recorded.

2.3 Information is collected on the number of visits by clients and outreach workers on behalf of clients undertaking a NSES transaction; the number of packs issued; returns of used equipment; year of birth and gender of the client. As data are collected in an anonymised form – to help underscore confidentiality and thus underpin confidence in the scheme – it is not possible to report directly on the number of individuals using the NSES during the year.

3. Number of Visits

- **3.1** There were 13,389 visits to NSES in 2008/09 and the number of visits were evenly spread across the four quarters within the year (Table 1).





Figure 1. Visits by HSSB: 2008/09

- 3.2 The majority of visits (84%) took place at pharmacies based within the Northern (43%) and Eastern (41%) Health and Social Services Boards (HSSB). The Western HSSB accounted for 15% of the visits and the Southern HSSB had the lowest number of visits (139 visits or 1%) (Figure 1; Table 2).

4. Return Rates


Figure 2. Return Rate by HSSB: 2008/09

4.1 Since 1st April 2007 when changes were made to the NSES Daily Log, the return rate is now calculated as the number of cin bins returned as a percentage of the number issued at every visit. In 2008/09, over half (53%) of cin bins were returned. This return rate varied across the four HSSBs from 44% in the Northern HSSB, 47% in the Eastern HSSB, 74% in the Southern HSSB to 83% in the Western HSSB (Table 3; Figure 2).

5. Syringes Issued

5.1 There were 135,700 syringes issued in 2008/09 (Table 4). The Northern HSSB issued the highest number of syringes (55,005; 41%), followed by the Eastern HSSB (46,710; 34%), then the Western HSSB (32,030; 24%) and the Southern HSSB issued the lowest number of syringes (1,955; 1%) (Figure 3).

Figure 3. Syringes Issued by HSSB: 2008/09




6. Profile of Service Users

Age and Gender


- **6.1** Over four fifths of visits (86%) were made by male clients (Table 5).
- 6.2 The mean age of clients using the NSES was 32 years. Over half (55%) of all visits were made by clients aged 31 years and over, just over a quarter (26%) by 26-30 year olds and a fifth (20%) by clients aged 25 years and under (Figure 4; Table 6).

6.3 There was some variation in the age profile for visits by males and females. Among males, the largest proportion of visits (26%) was made by 31-35 year olds, whereas among females, the largest proportion of visits (27%) was made by those in the 26-30 age group. The proportions of visits made by males and females aged 25 years and under were fairly similar, 20% and 19% respectively. A larger proportion of visits were made by females aged 36 years and over (32%) than males in this age group (29%) (Figure 5; Table 7).

7. Outreach Visits

7.1 In 2008/09, 108 of the 13,389 visits (less than 1%) to the participating pharmacies were made by outreach workers on behalf of a client (Table 8). In this report these visits are referred to as outreach visits.

Return Rates & Syringes Issued

7.2 A total of 220 cin bins were issued by outreach workers in 2008/09 and just over half (51%) were returned. A total of 2,070 syringes were issued by outreach workers during 2008/09 (Table 8).

Age & Gender

7.3 Almost three quarters of outreach visits (72%) were for male clients and 28% were for female clients (Table 9). More than half (54%) of the outreach visits were for clients aged 31-35 years (Table 10). It should be noted that for a large proportion of outreach visits the client's gender and/or year of birth was not recorded.

8. Comparisons: 2007/08 and 2008/09


Number of Visits

In 2008/09 there was an 18% 8.1 (2,002) increase in the number of visits since 2007/08 (13,389 compared to 11,387). The proportion of visits that took place in the Northern HSSB was similar in both years (43% in 2008/09 and 44% in 2007/08). The proportion of visits that took place in the Eastern HSSB decreased slightly to 41% in 2008/09 from 43% in 2007/08. The proportion of visits in the Western HSSB increased to 15% in 2008/09 from 12% in 2007/08, whereas in the Southern HSSB the proportions remained the same across the two years (1%) (Table 11).

Return Rate

8.2 The overall return rate (percentage of visits where at least one cin bin was returned) has remained fairly similar; 53% in 2008/09 and 54% in 2007/08. The return rates decreased in the Northern HSSB (to 44% in 2008/09 from 46% in 2007/08) and the Eastern HSSB (to 47% in 2008/09 from 53% in 2007/08). However, the return rates increased in the Western HSSB to 83% in 2008/09 from 76% in 2007/08 and in the Southern HSSB to 74% in 2008/09 from 52% in 2007/08 (Figure 6; Table 12).

Figure 6. Return Rate: 2007/08 and 2008/09




Syringes Issued

8.3 In Northern Ireland in 2008/09, 135,700 syringes were issued, this is a 16% increase from 116,935 syringes issued in 2007/08. In both years the Northern HSSB (41% in 2008/09 and 42% in 2007/08) accounted for the largest proportion of syringes issued, followed by the Eastern HSSB (34% in 2008/09 and 39% in 2007/08) and then the Western HSSB (24% in 2008/09 and 19% in 2007/08). The Southern HSSB accounted for 1% of all syringes issued in each of the years (Table 13).

Age and Gender

- **8.4** The proportion of visits by both male and female clients was the same in 2007/08 and 2008/09: 86% of the visits were by males and 14% by females (Table 14).
- 8.5 The age profile of clients at each visit in 2008/09 was generally similar to that in 2007/08. In 2008/09, 20% of visits were by clients aged 25 years and under compared to 16% in 2007/08. The proportion of clients aged 26-35 years decreased over the year to 51% in 2008/09 from 56% in 2007/08. There was a similar proportion of clients aged 36 years and over in 2008/09 (29%) and in 2007/08 (28%) (Figure 7; Table 15).

Outreach Visits

- **8.6** In 2008/09 there were 108 outreach visits; this is an increase of 32% on the 82 visits in 2007/08. A total of 2,070 syringes were issued by outreach workers in 2008/09, compared to 1,330 syringes issued in 2007/08 an increase of 56% (Table 16).
- **8.7** There were 220 bins issued by outreach workers in 2008/09 compared to 144 issued the previous year. The return rate increased from 42% in 2007/08 to 51% in 2008/09 (Table 16).

10. Editorial Notes

- **10.1** Percentages may not always add to 100 due to rounding.
- **10.2** A cin bin is a sealed container which is used to safely dispose of used needles and syringes. One is contained in every NSES pack.

- **10.3** A return visit is a visit where at least one cin bin is returned.
- **10.4** An outreach visit is a visit made by an outreach worker on behalf of another individual.


